REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 John 6:51-58

As human beings, we all desire one thing...life. As regards our physical life, we want to be healthy, fit, and free from sickness and illness. But we desire more than physical life, we want to be free and use our gifts and talents. The great psychologist Abraham Maslow described this search as the desire for self-actualization. In other words, all of us want to find our real self and live up to our potential. But there is another type of life to which Jesus himself is the real substance. Jesus is that life that gives meaning and purpose and ultimately joy and fulfillment. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus gives himself totally, body and blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. In the consecrated bread and wine, Jesus gives us eternal life now in this present world. But for us to become what we eat, we must be willing to die to self and rise to life in him. That is what we celebrate on this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

As we explore this theme of Jesus as the bread of life, we first reflect on the Old Testament reading from Deuteronomy. Moses, the great prophet, is reminding the people that God has from the beginning guided, guarded, and given his people what they need. He has been their life. Out of love, God called them from bondage in Egypt to become a free people. And throughout their wandering in the desert for forty years, he molded them into his special people. One of the major signs of his presence to his people in the desert was his gift of the manna. The people longed to return to the fleshpots of Egypt, but God gave them a better food in the gift of the daily manna. God commanded them to only gather enough manna from the wilderness for their daily consumption, and not to store it for later use. And although the manna was to sustain them on their journey. God was pointing to himself as the only food to truly satisfy their hun-

In the Gospel of John, Jesus takes up this importance of the manna, and claims the Father, not Moses, gives the true manna. The real manna is Jesus himself. In today's Gospel passage, Jesus goes on to say that his flesh and blood is the real food that all persons search for. In fact, John Chapter 6 from which our reading comes from is a portrayal of Jesus as a replacement for the Passover lamb. Like the lamb who was sacrificed to save the people from the angel of death, Jesus gives himself in the ultimate sacrifice for the salvation of the world. Jesus does this by giving us his body and blood that we might feed on him and come to life. Jesus promised his disciples and the Jews that he was the real food that would sustain them. cause he spoke in such a manner, many of his listeners turned away from him. In fact, Jesus even questions his disciples about their loyalty to him after proclaiming this message. Jesus' message is challenging and yet lifegiving.

As we reflect on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, I believe this dovetails nicely with the National Eucharistic Revival initiated by the bishops of the United States. For three years beginning with 2023 and ending in 2025, the Church in America is called to revitalize our understanding

and appreciation for the Eucharist. We are being asked as the American Church to deepen our worship, our beliefs, and living our faith in the Holy Eucharist. We do that by coming to Mass with open and prayerful hearts. Secondly, we have to give ourselves to full and conscious participation in the Mass. That means our mind, body, and heart are given to praise and worship God as a community of believers. As a part of this, we come prepared by having read the Scripture readings and reflected on them. Finally, we have to develop and nourish a personal relationship with God through prayer and adhering to God's commands. But we also have to nourish our relationships to other members of our parish family, and from there we are sent out on mission to spread the Gospel to all people.

NOVENA TO ST. ISIDORE THE FARMER FOR RAIN

How to Pray the Novena

Begin with the Sign of the Cross. Read the daily scripture verse (and spend a few moments meditating on it. Pray the daily novena prayer followed by the prayer in honor of St. Isidore and the <u>Our Father</u>, <u>Hail Mary</u>, and <u>Glory Be</u> **three times** for the intention of the Holy Father. Conclude with the Prayer for Rain and the Sign of the Cross.

Prayer in Honor of St. Isidore

O God, who taught Adam the simple art of tilling the soil, and who through Jesus Christ, the true vine, revealed Yourself the husbandman of our souls, deign, we pray, through the merits of Blessed Isidore, to instill into our hearts a horror of sin and a love of prayer, so that, working the soil in the sweat of our brow, we may enjoy eternal happiness in heaven. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Rain

O God, in Whom we live and move, and have our being, grant us rain, in due abundance, that, being sufficiently helped with temporal, we may the more confidently seek after eternal gifts. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIRST DAY: PARTNERSHIP WITH GOD (Genesis 1:25 and 2:15)

Prayer: Grant, we beseech You, merciful Lord, through the intercession of Blessed Isidore, farmer and confessor, not to let us be vain with the wisdom of the world, but by his merits and example, let us in all humility always do what is pleasing to You. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SECOND DAY: FAMILY LIFE IN CHRIST (Psalm 26:4-5)

Prayer: We offer the sacrifice of praise, O Lord, and humbly pray that through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin, Mother of God, and of St. Joseph, You may establish our families in peace and grace. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

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THIRD DAY: *LOVE OF NEIGHBOR* (Romans 12:9-12)

Prayer: O God, You who make all things work together unto good for those who love You, give to our hearts an abiding love for You: so that the desires we conceive by Your inspiration may ever remain unchanged in spite of every temptation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOURTH DAY: DIGNITY OF WORK (2 Thessalonians 3:8-12)

Prayer: O Lord, let us follow the blessed farmer Isidore's example of patience and humility, and walk so faithfully in his footsteps that by his intercession in the evening of life, we can offer You a rich harvest of merits and good works. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIFTH DAY: WALKING IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD (1 Timothy 4:15-16)

Prayer: Breathe into our hearts, we beseech You, O Lord, a desire for heavenly glory, and grant that we may pass, bearing in our hands the sheaves of justice, to where the Blessed Isidore is resplendent with You in glory. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SIXTH DAY: STEWARDSHIP OF THE SOIL (James 5:7-10)

Prayer: Pour down Your blessing, we beseech You, O Lord, upon Your people, and upon all the fruits of the earth, so that when collected they may be mercifully distributed to the honor and glory of Your holy name. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SEVENTH DAY: RURAL WORKS OF MERCY (Matthew 6:19-20)

Prayer: May the grace of the Holy Spirit, we beseech You, O Lord, enlighten our hearts, and refresh them abundantly with the sweetness of perfect charity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

EIGHTH DAY: TRUST IN PRAYER (Philippians 4:4-7)

Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, Who has said: Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you; grant, we beseech You, to us Your supplicants, the gift of Your most divine love, so that we may love You with our whole heart and in all our words and works, and never cease praising You. Who live and reign world without end. Amen.

NINTH DAY: SACRIFICE OF PRAISE (Hebrews 10:12-14)

Prayer: Protect us, O Lord, who offer holocausts to You, and sear our hearts with the flame of Your divine charity, so that they may be ever more fervently prepared for sacrifice. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
