#### Reflection

Not as the world gives anything, does Jesus give us peace. And yet, we expect the world to bring us peace? Look around. Is your world giving you much peace? And the peace Jesus left us, the peace Jesus gives? Again, look around, where is it?

I'm reminded of the woman at the well who asked Jesus, "Where then can you get this living water?" I ask, "Where then can you get this peace?" I have no bucket and the well is deep.

Peace? I have teen-aged drivers in my house, grandkids who moved across the country, an ailing wife, a beloved dog that died, parents (dignified elders that they are) who need me as I needed them 50 years ago. Peace? I seek it out, but it's fleeting; like Jesus, peace passes through my midst, through the walls and out into the ether. Having absorbed the scriptures over nearly 30 years in pastoral music, I still struggle to find peace. For me, peace is ordinary time.

We're left to contemplate Paul's letter to the Philippians, "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." The peace of God transcends all understanding. That's enough for me today. I'll sit out under a tree this beautiful spring day and contemplate that glorious mystery, aware that at the heart of all that matters is Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega, who alone gives peace for all eternity.

## **Prayer**

God, whose peace transcends all understanding, give us the strength to overcome our fear and anxiety when the world doesn't give the peace we seek, and the wisdom to know that only in Christ Jesus can we find true peace. Amen.

be provided by Trilogy. Picnic lunch at 6:00; Adam Capps Band at 7:00; veteran's tribute at intermission. Bring a lawn chair. There will be a 50/50 raffle and an auction. All funds raised go towards maintenance of Holy Cross Church. Everyone is welcome.
