## FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

### The Truth Can Be Uncomfortable.

If we look at the first reading today, we see that Peter is going out among his own people and giving them the Truth in an unambiguous manner. He directly accuses them of the death of Christ and the release of Barabbas. He then helps them understand that although they are guilty, their ignorance clouded their judgment; however, he doesn't excuse their actions. The final thing he does is to tell them to repent and be converted so their sins may be wiped away.

I think this could go a long way to help us understand how to be a witness to our culture today. It has become the "compassionate" thing to do to turn a blind eye, or to buy in wholesale to the evil others are involved in and accept it as a good. One does not have to look very far to see that much of our culture has accepted the evils of promiscuity, pornography, same-sex relationships, transgender ideology, abortion and much more. Sadly, this is also true among many Catholics. However, compassion is not about turning a blind eye. Love is not about letting someone live a lie. These are both false views due to people's lack of the true Virtue of courage and the adoption of culture's so-called virtues of acceptance and tolerance. Compassion means to suffer with and to love means to desire and work for the good of the other. It is not compassion if we are helping to celebrate an evil. It is not loving if we are approving of sinful lifestyles.

What I am not saying is that we should go out and bash people for the sins they are adhering to in their own lives. This would not be the Christian witness we are called to be. But what I am saying is that we have to get ourselves ready to be uncomfortable. We have to be willing to counter our culture and lovingly guide those in our lives who are living in sin.

Not every situation will be the same, but Peter has shown us the way to bring people back to God. We must give the Truth in love (desiring their salvation), help to instruct the ignorant, and call people to conversion. I pray we are the kind of people that would want to be brought out of ignorance and into the light. And if we want this for ourselves, we have to want it for others.

Both in last week's readings and this week's, we are told that if we love God and claim to know him, we would keep His Commandments. The eighth Commandment commands us to not lie and this week's second reading also tells us that those who do not keep his commandments "are liars, and the truth is not in them." So, either we Love God and neighbor, or we don't. If we don't, we will accept the evil of others and won't lovingly call them out of their sin. If we do, we have to work to bring them into the light, for he who lives out what he professes finds "the love of God is truly perfected in him". It is this love that will conquer hearts.

Holy Spirit, give us the courage to walk with others, speak the truth and guide them to you. May we be your instruments of love to this world.


