REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Jeremiah 20:10-13 Romans 5:12-15 Matthew 10:26-33

Jeremiah in the first reading and Jesus in the Gospel speak about the reality of persecution for standing up for our faith. Both men endured ill-treatment in their lives. Many of the saints experienced trials and mistreatment for standing up for the faith. So why isn't there more persecution in today's society? Maybe we're like the one scholar who when asked if he were a Christian said the following, "Yes, but not offensively so!". Have we so conformed to the ways of society and the world that no one takes us seriously? When discussing sensitive subjects, I find myself keeping my mouth shut for fear of upsetting the status quo. Jeremiah and Jesus both announce that standing up for what's right will cost us. Yet, both proclaim that God's reign will come, and God will watch over and take care of those faithful to his message. Jesus said it best, "Fear no one".

When it comes to fear, Jeremiah frequently used the phrase "terror on every side" to indicate the mistreatment he felt Of all the Old Testament prophets, from God's people. Jeremiah is often labeled as the prophet who most complained about the way he felt God had treated him. Jeremiah felt God had duped him into being this prophet who would proclaim the message the people didn't want to hear. Jeremiah even witnessed the destruction of the kingdom of Judah and the exile of the people into Babylon. Yet in the second half of today's pericope, Jeremiah is firm in confessing that God would not abandon him. The question is not will God save his faithful, but when will God save his people. In the final verse of today's passage, Jeremiah praises God for saving the poor, and the poor are not those who are economically disadvantaged but those who rely solely on God for their life.

Relying solely on God is the conviction behind Jesus' statement that the Twelve should fear no one. Today we hear from Jesus' missionary discourse to his apostles, and his message is quite simple. Do not be afraid! Jesus is telling his Twelve that they are to preach his word to all. As Patricia Datchuck Sanchez says in today's reflection on this Gospel, Matthew in referring to those things spoken in darkness is pointing to the reality that Jesus' teaching must be proclaimed to all. Jesus then reiterates again his command to "fear not" because those who persecute cannot kill the soul, only the body. God himself is the one who can kill both body and soul. Then Jesus goes on to say that "Not one ground without your knowledge." Sanchez says the real translation of that statement is "not a single sparrow lights upon the ground without your Father's consent". Just think of all the times you see a bird land on the ground and take off again. If God knows all the many movements of an ordinary bird, how much more will he be aware of our needs as human persons? Yet, Jesus ends this passage by calling us to acknowledge and be faithful to the Gospel. The Gospel demands that we go out and tell all the world, but that "going forth" will entail hardships and persecution.

As we reflect on how we might live differently because of these readings, one thing is certain. God will not abandon us. God will be besides us. Yet, there will also be persecution, suffering, and even death for some. Spreading the

message of the kingdom will cost us. It might mean rejection, loss of social status, loss of friendship, and abandonment from those whom we love. Jesus knows what the cost of discipleship is for our lives. He points to the cost by asking us to look upon his crucifixion, but he also promises us life with himself in the eternal kingdom. Let's support each other as Church in living out our commitment to the Gospel.

NOVENA TO ST. ISIDORE THE FARMER FOR RAIN

<u>How to Pray the Novena</u>

Begin with the Sign of the Cross. Read the daily scripture verse (and spend a few moments meditating on it. Pray the daily novena prayer followed by the prayer in honor of St. Isidore and the <u>Our Father</u>, <u>Hail Mary</u>, and <u>Glory Be</u> **three times** for the intention of the Holy Father. Conclude with the Prayer for Rain and the Sign of the Cross.

Prayer in Honor of St. Isidore

O God, who taught Adam the simple art of tilling the soil, and who through Jesus Christ, the true vine, revealed Yourself the husbandman of our souls, deign, we pray, through the merits of Blessed Isidore, to instill into our hearts a horror of sin and a love of prayer, so that, working the soil in the sweat of our brow, we may enjoy eternal happiness in heaven. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Rain

O God, in Whom we live and move, and have our being, grant us rain, in due abundance, that, being sufficiently helped with temporal, we may the more confidently seek after eternal gifts. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIRST DAY: PARTNERSHIP WITH GOD (Genesis 1:25 and 2:15)

Prayer: Grant, we beseech You, merciful Lord, through the intercession of Blessed Isidore, farmer and confessor, not to let us be vain with the wisdom of the world, but by his merits and example, let us in all humility always do what is pleasing to You. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SECOND DAY: FAMILY LIFE IN CHRIST (Psalm 26:4-5)

Prayer: We offer the sacrifice of praise, O Lord, and humbly pray that through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin, Mother of God, and of St. Joseph, You may establish our families in peace and grace. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

THIRD DAY: *LOVE OF NEIGHBOR* (Romans 12:9-12)

FOURTH DAY: *DIGNITY OF WORK* (2 Thessalonians 3:8-12)

Prayer: O Lord, let us follow the blessed farmer Isidore's example of patience and humility, and walk so faithfully in his footsteps that by his intercession in the evening of life, we can offer You a rich harvest of merits and good works. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

FIFTH DAY: WALKING IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD (1 Timothy 4:15-16)

Prayer: Breathe into our hearts, we beseech You, O Lord, a desire for heavenly glory, and grant that we may pass, bearing in our hands the sheaves of justice, to where the Blessed Isidore is resplendent with You in glory. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SIXTH DAY: STEWARDSHIP OF THE SOIL (James 5:7-10)

Prayer: Pour down Your blessing, we beseech You, O Lord, upon Your people, and upon all the fruits of the earth, so that when collected they may be mercifully distributed to the honor and glory of Your holy name. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SEVENTH DAY: RURAL WORKS OF MERCY (Matthew 6:19-20)

Prayer: May the grace of the Holy Spirit, we beseech You, O Lord, enlighten our hearts, and refresh them abundantly with the sweetness of perfect charity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

EIGHTH DAY: TRUST IN PRAYER (Philippians 4:4-7)

Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, Who has said: Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you; grant, we beseech You, to us Your supplicants, the gift of Your most divine love, so that we may love You with our whole heart and in all our words and works, and never cease praising You. Who live and reign world without end. Amen.

NINTH DAY: SACRIFICE OF PRAISE (Hebrews 10:12-14)

Prayer: Protect us, O Lord, who offer holocausts to You, and sear our hearts with the flame of Your divine charity, so that they may be ever more fervently prepared for sacrifice. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
