FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul

One of the greatest testaments to Jesus' resurrection just may be the example given by the Apostles. Today, we celebrate the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. These are two men who gave everything, including their own lives to proclaim the Gospel to the world. St. Peter was crucified on a cross upside down and St. Paul was beheaded.

Before his death, St. Paul was whipped (almost to the point of death) many times, was beaten with rods, stoned and left for dead, shipwrecked 3 times, imprisoned multiple times and many more hardships. St. Peter was imprisoned on more than one occasion, was beaten along with the other Apostles by orders from the Sanhedrin and was persecuted heavily. There was no fame, money, power or prestige to be had by proclaiming the Gospel, but there was the greatest reward that any man can hope for - eternal communion with our Lord.

It is through the example of these men and all of the early Christian witnesses that made the faith spread like wild-fire. Some estimates show there is a likelihood that within 2 centuries of Christ's death, there were already several million Christians.

In this world that is becoming more polarizing every day, let us remember the words of Jesus Himself: "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you [falsely] because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." If we are lovingly proclaiming Christ to the world and it hates us for it, then we must be doing something right for Jesus tells us "If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, the world would love its own; but because you do not belong to the world, and I have chosen you out of the world, the world hates you."

Let us courageously go forth and share the good news with others that we too may be the examples our world needs to turn toward our redeemer and share everlasting life with Him.

Bible Reflection ~ Stewardship Goal

"I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." (2 TIMOTHY 4:7)

How many of us can say this? St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "God doesn't call us to be successful, he calls us to be faithful." How many times have we been blinded by the success of the world at the expense of our faith? Matthew Kelly says, "Take one minute each day to remind yourself that you are just passing through this life and will die one day; you will live more intentionally with a passion and purpose."

During June, we have celebrated key moments in the life of the Church - Pentecost, the Most Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi culminating today with the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Though very different men, they are united in faith, mission, and martyrdom, and the Church has honored them together since the third century.

St. Peter, the first Pope, was chosen by Christ as the rock on which the Church would be built. The Catechism tells us that because of the faith he professed, Peter remains the "unshakeable rock of the Church." Despite his human weaknesses, Peter's loyalty, repentance, and leadership make him a powerful model of stewardship.

St. Paul, once a persecutor of Christians, became one of the Church's greatest evangelists. In today's second reading, Paul reflects on his mission, saying, "I have finished the race... the crown of righteousness awaits me." The Greek word he used for "crown" — stephanos — refers to a victor's crown, not a royal one, showing his view of faith as a race well-run for the sake of Christ.

Though they were martyred separately, tradition holds that Peter and Paul were in Rome at the same time, and their shared witness and sacrifice tie them closely together in Church history. They embody two vital aspects of stewardship — Peter in his faith and leadership, and Paul in his zeal and wisdom.

As stewards, we are called to follow their example — to build the Church through our commitment, to overcome our failures through God's mercy, and to proclaim the Gospel with courage. Like Peter and Paul, we are invited to give all we have for the sake of Christ and His Church.

School Councils and the Heartland Parishes

There are three councils for Holy Family Elementary and Thomas More Prep-Marian.

Two are School Advisory Councils—one for Holy Family and one for TMP-Marian.

The third is a Finance Advisory Council which handles the finances for both schools.

These councils have similar functions to a public school board. But while a public school board implements policy, these Councils are consultative to the pastor of the school.

Since Holy Family Elementary is run by Immaculate Heart of Mary, Fr. Nick Parker (as pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary) makes the final decision.

TMP-Marian is a diocesan school. Bishop Vincke has the final say. Since the Bishop's schedule won't allow him to attend the board meetings, he has appointed Geoff Andrews (Diocesan Superintendent) and me to be his designate on this board.

The members of these councils are drawn from the Heartland Parishes. All three Hays parishes—St. Joseph's, Immaculate Heart and St. Nick's—each have representatives on these boards. The outlying parishes of Munjor, Schoenchen, Antonino and Catherine provide one representative for the four parishes.

The members of these councils are appointed. The school administration, pastor and the Diocese recruit candidates.

The terms are three years long and you can serve two consecutive terms before you have to step down.

Cammi Williby is the Outlying Parishes representative from Munjor for the TMP board; Jill Moeder was the representative on the Finance Committee and Amy Pfannenstiel is on the Heartland Stewardship Committee.

Today we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This beautiful feast celebrates the gift of the Eucharist, which the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches is the source and summit of our Christian faith. "For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself" (CCC paragraph 1324).

The very word, Eucharist, means "thanksgiving" or "gratitude" and so this feast is especially meaningful to all of us who are striving to live as grateful stewards of all God's blessings to us. Surely the Eucharist is the greatest of all blessings because it is not only from God, it is God — the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Today's second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us of the depths of love our Lord has shown us in the gift of the Eucharist, recalling Christ's words at the very first Eucharistic celebration. "The Lord Jesus... took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you." In that moment, and at every celebration of the Mass thereafter, Jesus gives us His very self in an act of complete humility and perfect love. How can we possibly show our gratitude for such a sublime gift?

We can receive the gift of the Eucharist with the greatest possible reverence and love. And, following our Lord's example, we can give ourselves generously to others in the week ahead.
