FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

I find it fitting to write about the papacy as we have just witnessed the election of Pope Leo XIV. This topic is cause for much dissension among Christians, but is a wonderful blessing given to us by Christ Himself.

In today's reading, we see there is an argument among the Christian community as to what is required to become a Christian. Notice, it is not a vote of those arguing that decides the outcome. It is also not that each person went their own way and started their own church because they couldn't agree. It says "The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives." This right here is showing us the authority of the hierarchy of the Church. It is the Apostles, the elders (Greek word for Bishops) and the teaching authority of the Church through them that put an end to this issue. We also see that Scripture says "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us." This is how the holy office of the Pope and the Bishops in union with him work. They don't roll dice, or pull a decision out of a hat to decide on what is needed for salvation. Instead, they are led by the Holy Spirit to not teach in error.

Finally, as important as the Bible is, we have to remember that Christ gave us the Church, which in turn gave us the Bible. It is not the other way around. Without the Church to guide us, (if we live by the Bible alone, which is actually not biblical) we make ourselves into our own Pope. This means, we are deciding what is needed for salvation, rather than being docile to the Holy Spirit through Christ's Church.

Today, thank Jesus for giving His authority to His Church that we might be enlightened to the teachings of the Holy Spirit and be guided by His Vicar on earth!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued.

Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and at ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow HIs teachings.

To keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make the study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives.

If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries will radiate with the warmth of God's love. And our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.
