# Working For Pay, Or Working For The Kingdom?

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us a hired man cares for his own hide and runs away in the face of danger. A true shepherd will die for his sheep.

As we go through our lives, what is the driving force behind why we do what we do? Every one of us has been given a vocation, and a vocation is a call from God to love and serve Him and His church in a specific way. Stated another way, I think it could be said that this is the specific way God wants us to help save souls.

As a married man, my vocation is to my family. It is my responsibility to live in such a way that I am doing my best to get them to one day be with our Heavenly Father. The question then becomes, am I a shepherd of my family or a hired hand? Am I doing everything I can to be a witness of Christ to my family and protecting them from the evils of the world, or am I letting earthly desires and/or concerns get in the way of my mission and their vocation?

So, what happens when we become hired hands instead of shepherds? Parents worry about the wolves of the fear of missing out for their children and give into things that draw their children away from their vocation. Look at the shortage of priests and religious vocations we currently have. This is not due to a lack of God calling them, but to a lack of our society's answering. We also know that marriage rates are at an all time low. We see the same wolves of the fear of missing out rearing their ugly heads here. People want to "keep their options open" instead of making a commitment. Instead of being shepherds of the beautiful gift of matrimony, many people have become hired hands that run away when difficulty arises. So, the vocational call to Holy orders and the religious life is not the only one suffering. We are in general lacking in all vocations.

Instead of understanding God is calling each one of us to shepherd others into His kingdom, many see this life as just trying to pass time between one pleasurable experience to the next. A hired hand that is just waiting for the work day to be over so they can go play. When this becomes our worldview, we can see why people don't want to choose a path that requires sacrifice.

But not all is lost. We can overcome the wolves of the fear of missing out by truly trusting in God. Whatever He has planned for us and our loved ones is what will bring us true peace and joy in this world and the next. Not only will we not be missing out, but we will be gaining the kingdom!

I leave you with one of my favorite pieces of scripture that will keep us centered on God and not worrying about the anxieties of this world. It is from the Gospel of Matthew 6:25

"Therefore, I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what

you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? <sup>26</sup> Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And which of you by being anxious can add one cubit to his span of life? 28 And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; 29 yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O men of little faith? 31 Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For the Gentiles seek all these things; and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. 33 But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well.


