REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Luke 5: 1-11

In the song entitled "Summons" found in our missalettes, we sing this opening line, "Will you come and follow me, if I but call your name". Jesus calls or summons each of us in a personal, intimate way. It is a call unique to you and no one else. It is a call that brings a mission and also a realization of our sinfulness. In today's three readings, Isaiah, Paul, and the apostles receive a call. All of them come to realize their unworthiness. Yet God purges them all of their sin, and then sends them out to be "fishers of men". Let us learn from this pattern found in today's readings, that God indeed is summoning us to spread the Gospel in a way that is totally unique. We realize how inadequate we are in the face of such a sacred task. Yet God purifies us and empowers us to go out and fulfill his mission. Let us heed Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid".

In today's first reading, Isaiah receives his call from God in a profound manner. While worshiping in the temple, Isaiah receives a mysterious vision. This vision is of a heavenly temple in which angels are adorning God singing what you and I sing also at Mass..."Holy, holy, holy Lord of hosts". By describing the frame of the door as shaking and the house being filled with smoke, Isaiah was indicating a theophany or a revelation of God's presence. Realizing God's awesome presence, Isaiah also knows in his very being that he is a sinner unworthy to be in God's presence. Yet, God doesn't allow his sinfulness to stand in his way. Instead, God symbolically cleanses Isaiah by having one of the seraphim take an ember and burn away his sin. Then the voice of God is heard asking who will go to do the work of prophesying. Isaiah responds that he will go.

Like Isaiah, Paul in the second reading realizes his unworthiness. Paul, unlike the regular twelve apostles, was made an apostle through a profound encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus. Paul feels he is unworthy because before this encounter Paul was aggressively persecuting the early Church. Yet Paul realizes and states quite clearly that it was by God's grace, or pure gift, that God forgave him and then called him to spread the Gospel especially to the Gentiles. Recognizing his sinfulness, Paul cooperated with God's grace by working harder than all of them.

Finally, we hear in Luke's Gospel, Jesus' call to Peter and James and John. Like the call of Isaiah and St. Paul, Peter is reluctant to God's initial invitation. Jesus invites Peter to put out his nets into deeper waters, and Peter responds that they have been unsuccessful all night and want to just hang it up. When they do what Jesus tells them, they are rewarded with a huge catch of fish so large that it takes two boats to haul it in, and both boats are in danger of sinking. Peter then falls on his knees and declares his unworthiness. Jesus doesn't allow that action to stop him from calling Simon Peter to a greater mission. Jesus summons Peter and his companions to "catch men" which literally means,

"You shall be taking them alive". In other words, Peter will be saving others from the death of sin and bringing them alive into Jesus' kingdom.

You and I don't often realize that God has a unique mission or calling for each of us. God has a plan for each of us that no one else in the world can fulfill. Most of us don't take the time to discern what that call is and where it leads for our lives. Secondly, we like Isaiah, Paul, and Peter feel inadequate and afraid of our sacred mission. We say, "Why me Lord?". Surely, there is someone else who can do it better than me. God responds by reassuring that his grace is enough for us. His awesome power can overcome all our reluctance, fear, and inadequacy. Hopefully we hear these words in our heart, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?".
