FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

Laying The Foundation

Today, Jesus talks about laying the foundation. As parents, Godparents, Grandparents, aunts, uncles, etc., we have been given the charge to lay the foundation for the generations to come after us. At a baptism, the parents of the child are told they are accepting the responsibility of training their child up in the faith. They are then asked if they clearly understand what they are undertaking. They respond that they do and it is to this point where we can find one of the big indicators between whether a child will leave the Christian faith, or embrace it. If the parents are serious in their duty to raise their child according to Christ and His Church, the child has a way higher chance of staying in the faith after they leave the house. However, as a wise priest once told me, "once parents show a child that Mass is optional, it will become unnecessary to the child." The same goes for the faith as a whole. If the faith is not being lived out at home, the children will quite easily find their way out.

Godparents are the next line of defense for the safety of a child's soul. During the baptismal rite, they are asked if they are ready to help the parents of the child in their duty as Christian parents. They must answer I do to take on the role of the Godparent. When they do, this is a great undertaking as the role of the Godparent is to pray that child to heaven and be another living example of Christ. This becomes even more important if the parents fail in their duty, for the Godparents are promising to pick it up and make sure this child is getting to the Sacraments and are getting the spiritual guidance they need. Being a Godparent has nothing to do with them being a nice person, but has everything to do with living in conformity with Christ so the child sees it and wants to take that life upon themselves. This is why Godparents must be Catholic and in good standing. No matter how nice a person is, they cannot be a witness to the Catholic faith if they are not Catholic. If they are Catholic, but not in good standing, then they also cannot be a witness to the faith as they are not living it out themselves.

For extended family and our parish family, we are also part of the line of defense, working for the salvation of souls. This is why I always love when there is a baptism during Mass. I understand it means Mass is going to be a whole 5 minutes longer, but it also means the entire congregation just got invited to this child's spiritual birthday. As their parish family, we can and should intercede on their behalf and live out the faith for them to see.

If we all take seriously the call of Christ to lay the foundation for the next generation, we will watch our parish and community continue to grow and flourish. I think we are blessed here at St. Nicholas to have an active parish with wonderful examples of Christ. It is because of the living witnesses of Christ in my own life that I am Catholic today. Never underestimate the power of intercessory prayer and being a living witness on behalf of the next generation. Trust me, they notice.

THE NUMBERS: 2023 IN KANSAS

- 19,467 abortions were reported a 58% increase from 2022.
- To put this into perspective: this would fill Wichita's Intrust Bank Arena or Allen Fieldhouse beyond capacity.
- 62 abortions were performed every 8-hour workday, Monday through Saturday.
- 78% were performed on out-of-state residents.
- 67% were performed using chemical abortion pills.
- 600 fully formed preborn babies were dismembered.
- 376 abortions were performed on minor girls, including 36 on young girls ages 10–14.
