St. Francis and the Nativity Scene

In 1220, Francis went to Holy Land to convert the Muslim rulers. He was able to preach to Saladin, the Muslim ruler. Saladin wasn't converted, but gave Francis permission to visit the Holy Sites. The Franciscans have been taking care of the Churches in the Holy Land ever since. Francis saw the site of the Nativity. He saw the Shepherd's Field. He was able to visit the site of Christ's birth.

When Francis got back to Italy, he, like any tourist, immediately started telling everyone that they needed to go to the Holy Land to see these incredible places.

But 800 years ago, pilgrimages to the Holy Land were rare things. Most people lived out their lives no more than 30 miles from where they were born.

But Francis wanted the people of Assisi to experience what he experienced in the Holy Land. So, if he couldn't bring the people to Bethlehem, he could bring Bethlehem to them.

In 1223, Francis asked the Pope for permission for a special project. He had a crib prepared, hay carried in and an ox and a donkey led to the place. He had a statue of the infant Jesus placed in the crib. Alongside, he put statues of Mary and Joseph, like what we have in church.

The friars were summoned, the people came, and the forest resounded with voices. That night was rendered brilliant and solemn by a multitude of bright lights and by resonant and harmonious hymns of praise. A solemn Mass was said over the crib. Francis served as deacon, preaching on the birth of a poor King. As Mass came to a close, Francis stood before the crib in adoration, eyes filled with affection, bathed in tears and overflowing with joy.

When Francis picked up the statue of the Infant to venerate it, it came alive. Witnesses saw Francis holding a beautiful little boy as he lifted it out of the crib.

Francis is the reason we have nativity scenes.
