Faith Is Not Blind

The Christian faith is not based on the complete unknown as if we just blindly follow what others tell us. On the other hand, there are still many mysteries in it. In this instance of the word mystery, we don't mean that we can't know anything about it. Instead, we mean that we will never know all there is to know about certain things like the Trinity. So where does this leave us in regard to what Faith actually is?

If we observe what we already know, we can see what faith in the ordinary sense is. Love and friendship both require faith, but it is not blind. We have friendships based on the reality that this person has shown themselves to be trustworthy. We often reciprocate love for we have seen our beloved is trustworthy in their love. In the end though, there is no scientific instrument that can measure friendship and love. We simply trust another person as we have seen their previous actions to be somewhat of a litmus test to who they are as a person.

Now that we see faith in the ordinary sense, what is Faith in the Theological virtue? In the example I gave above, sometimes people have ulterior motives and relationships fail, even after faith in that person has been given. With God however, there is no ulterior motive. When He speaks, it is always Truth. God has shown Himself through revelation and the incarnation that He is willing to give everything for us and is trustworthy, but now our faith must go beyond the natural sense as we are talking about the God of the universe, the pure act, the beginning and the end. No being can comprehend the mysteries of God. Therefore, we need supernatural Faith in regard to His mysteries and He is the one who infuses us with this gift. This is the Faith we have through the Holy Spirit working in our lives. It is infused in Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation. It must be cultivated and cared for if it is to remain alive in us. It allows us to trust in God and all that He has revealed, even if we can't fully comprehend it. It is as today's first reading states, that "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen."

If you struggle with any of the moral teachings of Christ through His Church, keep allowing the Holy Spirit to help you fight the good fight. Frequent the Sacraments and know that Christ cannot teach error, so whatever you are going through, He has the answer and will lead you to it.
