REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Jeremiah 31: 31-34
 Hebrews 5: 7-9
 John 12: 20-33

We often speak of the “heart of the matter” meaning what is the core or the crux of the situation. What’s the most important thing! We also say the “heart knows best”...implying that the core of our being determines who we are and what we do. The bottom line is what’s in our hearts defines who we are and the course of our actions. In today’s first reading from Jeremiah the prophet, God says the final covenant with his people Israel will be written on their hearts not on some stone. And in John’s Gospel Jesus speaks of “his hour” when he will be glorified. This most important hour speaks to the heart of his mission. This hour is when he will give his life on the cross, and then be raised up on the third day. For us the heart of who we are as Catholic Christians, the crux of the matter, is all about this dying and rising...the paschal mystery. And if we are to take to heart our faith, we must be willing to die to ourselves and rise to life in Christ.

Our first reading from the prophet Jeremiah is taken from what’s called the Book of Consolation chapters 30 to 33. In these three chapters, the prophet rekindles his people’s faith that God desires to love them and make them his own. God speaks tenderly to his people and tells them that he will release them from the bondage of captivity in Babylon and again make them his people. In today’s passage, God speaks about what Patricia Datchuck Sanchez calls in the “Word We Celebrate” an interiorization of the law. God wants to write the spirit of the law within the people of Israel. Because they had the law on the hearts they would now act or behave accordingly. We too, because of our baptism into Christ, have this law of love written in our hearts. If only we would rediscover the Spirit which God places within us. Then in John’s Gospel, some Greeks, non-believers, want to see Jesus. “To see” in John’s Gospel means more than using one’s eyes; it points to seeing or knowing with the heart. In other words, these Greeks want a relationship, a friendship with Jesus. It is then that Jesus lays out for all persons what his mission or “his hour” will entail. It requires a death like the grain of wheat falling into the ground only to produce much fruit. His “hour” and ours also demands a losing of our life to gain everlasting life.

So, we might ask ourselves have we taken to heart Jesus’ message? Have we interiorized the Gospel...inscribed it on our hearts? If we are serious about this, we know that to do that means some sort of dying...some type of suffering...some falling into the ground like the grain of wheat. And it is never a one-and-done decision. It requires a daily choice to die to selfishness and sin. Seeing our suffering and pain as a



way to resurrection and life in Christ is a lifelong struggle. What we do with our suffering says a great deal about our commitment to God. In our Lenten journey we can do all sorts of penances and give up all sorts of things. But when we face our sufferings and deal with the pain of our living that we go from mere surface to the heart of the matter. Father Richard Rohr says if we do not transform our pain we most assuredly transmit it. As we approach Holy Week and Jesus' passion, we too need to look at how we deal with the crosses that come our way. We pray that God will help us and guide us with his Spirit so we can die like that grain of wheat and produce great fruit. May God touch our hearts with his love!
