REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Deuteronomy 26:4-10 Romans 10:8-13 Luke 4:1-13

We begin our Lenten journey through our Sunday Scriptures by remembering and confessing. In fact, our entire Lenten journey could be encapsulated in the process of remembering who we are. We remember that through baptism we become sons and daughters of God through Jesus Christ our Lord in the power of the Holy Spirit. Recalling our baptism and journeying with the catechumens to their baptism during the Easter Vigil is our mission during Lent and throughout the Easter season. Along with remembering, we are, like Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit to confess that God is our Lord, and we will serve no one or no thing besides Him. The way we seek to remember is by refocusing our lives through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Our first reading from the book of Deuteronomy is a confession of sorts or a credal recitation of the Jewish people. Scholars consider this passage to be one of the most ancient and important ones in the Pentateuch. The Pentateuch is the first five books of the Bible. In this passage, we see a thanksgiving liturgy in which the first fruits of the land are offered to the God of Israel. Imitating their pagan neighbors who offered the first fruits to many nature gods, Israel also offered back to the God of all nature and history the fruits of the land. The reason this passage is such a foundational confession for the Israelites is that it lays out the core event of redemption for the Jewish people...the exodus from Egypt. The release from the slavery of Egypt was as foundational to the Israelites as the death and resurrection are to Christians. God chose the people of Israel, redeemed them from bondage in Egypt, and made them his special inheritance.

In the second reading today from Paul's letter to the Romans, we have another foundational confession or credal statement. This verse, "For if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" is thought to be one of the earliest statements of Christian faith. It was probably used in ancient baptismal liturgies. In this statement, Paul is saying that obedience to the law will not justify a person with God, but faith in one's heart that Jesus is Lord and saved us by dying on the cross and being raised up. And this belief is then articulated or voiced with our lips and all our actions to show the world that God has redeemed us.

Finally, we come to Jesus' confession to the power of the Father through the three temptations by the devil. In each temptation, the devil attempts to entice Jesus to disobedience by using possessions in the form of bread, power in the use of all the kingdoms of the world, and prestige in bowing down to the devil. In the temptation story, Jesus shows us how not to fall victim to the devil's allure. Instead, Jesus confesses that God is Lord alone and Him alone shall we serve.

What keeps us from remembering who we are...sons and daughters of God through baptism? We get caught up in ourselves. We think the universe revolves around us. The "I" becomes so big! With myself in supposed control, we long to amass toys and things. We want to gather more possessions, gain control with more power, and sit atop the world with greater prestige. Jesus shows us that it is in obedience or surrender to God's plan that we find true joy, happiness, and ourselves. We can't do it ourselves but with Him we can do great things. Happy Lent!
