**REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN**

Genesis 9: 8-15  
 1 Peter 3: 18-22  
 Mark 1: 12-15

“The Spirit drove Jesus into the desert.” Lent is our journey into the desert. Life is sojourn in the desert on our pilgrimage back to the Garden of Eden or our heavenly home. Throughout the Old Testament, the desert was the place where God led his people to purify their hearts and make them into His People. The forty years wandering in the wilderness was the pivotal moment in their quest for God. In Mark’s Gospel, Jesus, like the Israelites, is driven into the desert to face himself and come to know God more deeply. Jesus comes face to face with Satan or the Tempter. A battle ensues...a battle between Jesus and evil. And so, for us, Lent is time to enter the desert to face our demons and battle the sin and darkness within. It’s a battle we make each year and throughout our lifetime. The victor over sin and death is Jesus. And so we follow in his footsteps.

To enter the desert is scary. The desert is filled with wild beasts and is a place of aridity and loneliness. In the desert we come face-to-face with ourselves, our failures and sinfulness. We can in the desert run away and not do the hard work of admitting who we are and where we have come from. Praise God that he has made a covenant of love with us and leads us. In today’s first reading God promises Noah, his family, and all creation that he would never again send the waters of the flood to destroy the world. God promises through the sign of a rainbow that he will never again harm the earth. Filled with confidence in God’s promise, today’s second reading from the first letter of Peter reminds us why we live in hope and trust. Through Jesus’ saving death and glorious resurrection, we are made clean in the waters of Baptism and brought into union with our God. Just as the waters of the flood destroyed life so now the waters of Baptism bring about new life. Finally, in Mark’s Gospel, Jesus comes out of the desert where he did battle with Satan and begins his mission of bringing God’s reign into reality. Jesus throughout his life is victorious over Satan and sin. Jesus shows us how to journey through the desert by repenting and believing in his victory over all sin and death. Repentance and belief in his power over evil are the keys to make it out of the desert safely.

So how do we journey through Lent? How do we remain in the desert forty days and come out better people? Jesus in his life gives us the example. In two short verses, Mark tells us that Jesus sought God in prayer for forty days, Jesus fasted for forty days, and Jesus then went out and served other people. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are the keys to our Lenten journey. So, what kind of prayer is required? It is prayer that speaks to our

hearts. It is prayer in which we listen to God. Listening prayer is much more difficult than just saying a bunch of rote prayers. What type of fasting is necessary? While we might give up candy or sweets, the real fasting is from those things that stand in the way of our relationship to God and those around us. What are the real obstacles on our journey to becoming better people? This Lent we might need to fast from gossip and backbiting or maybe time spent on our mobile devices. Finally, what works of charity should we do? Maybe when it comes to charity it's not what we do, but how we do it. Are they done with love? My spiritual director tells me over and over...make it a delight and not a duty. So, let's step together into the desert of Lent!

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**PENANCE:** The Bishops of the U.S. remind us since we are not exempt from sinfulness, we should not consider ourselves exempt from penance. The Church's teaching regarding penance: **Abstinence** (not eating meat). Begins at age 14. **Fasting.** One full meal a day, with the other 2 meals without meat and together not equaling a full meal. Begins at age 18 and ends at age 60. Ash Wed. & Good Friday are days of abstinence & fasting. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Forms of penance are: abstinence, fasting, self-denial, actions of religion (increased prayer life, daily Mass, devotions, spiritual or Scriptural reading, acts of charity or witness).
