Is Baptism Necessary for Salvation?

Should we really be Baptizing our children, or should we let them decide when they are old enough?

In the covenant with Abraham, God proclaims: "Throughout the ages, every male among you, when he is eight days old, shall be circumcised. If a male is uncircumcised, that is, if the flesh of his foreskin has not been cut away, such a one will be cut off from his people; he has broken my covenant."

So, the way someone entered into the Abrahamic covenant with God and became part of His people was through circumcision. It was the duty of the parents to have their children circumcised, or they would be cutting them off from God's family. Obviously, this was not something to be taken lightly.

As Christians, we do not have to circumcise our children's flesh to bring them into the family of God. Instead, the new circumcision and the new sign in the covenant of Christ is Baptism. We can see this through the book of Colossians 2:11 where it says: "In him you were also circumcised with a circumcision not administered by hand, by stripping off the carnal body, with the circumcision of Christ. You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead." baptism is the sign of the new covenant, (just as circumcision was in the Abrahamic covenant) then to not baptize our children is to cut them off from the family of God.

We don't let our children figure out on their own if going out into the street before looking is a good idea. We don't let them decide if drinking the chemicals under the sink is a good idea. We don't even let them eat whatever they want, whenever they want and hope they will someday make the right choice. All of these things are detrimental to their health. As parents, we want them to be healthy and live a long life.

If we want our children to be spiritually healthy, then the best thing we can do is to make sure they are baptized. In doing so, they become an adopted child of God and are part of the body of Christ. An indelible mark is put on their soul and they are cleansed of original sin. Finally, they receive Sacramental graces they need to live out the Christian life.

And Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is to you and to your children and to all that are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him."
