FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

The psalm that this line comes from is attributed to king David and there is a story in the second book of Samuel about him that I think highlights this praise of God. It is the story of David bringing the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem.

The Ark was the visible sign of God among His chosen people. It was a golden box with angels on the top which held the Ten Commandments (God's word), manna (the miraculous bread from heaven), and the staff of Aaron (a sign of the true priesthood). On the top between the two angels was a place called the mercy seat. This is where God's presence dwelt. Because God dwelt there and because He had commanded it, nobody was allowed to touch the Ark or they would perish (this does happen once, by the way). They had to carry it with poles like a king would have been carried on a palanquin.

As David and his men are bringing the Ark into Jerusalem, scripture says: ¹⁴And David danced before the Lord with all his might... ¹⁵So David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the Lord with shouting, and with the sound of the horn. ¹⁶As the ark of the Lord came into the city of David, Michal the daughter of Saul looked out of the window, and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord; and she despised him in her heart.

David (the king of the Israelites) is dancing and rejoicing before God and his wife is ashamed by his actions. Scripture continues by telling us: ²⁰And David returned to bless his household. But Michal the daughter of Saul came out to meet David, and said, "How the king of Israel honored himself today, uncovering himself today before the eyes of his servants' maids, as one of the vulgar fellows shamelessly uncovers himself!"

So, how does David respond to his own wife (Michal) berating him for his open display of honoring God? ²¹And David said to Michal, "It was before the Lord, who chose me above your father, and above all his house, to appoint me as prince over Israel, the people of the Lord—and I will make merry before the Lord. ²²I will make myself yet more contemptible than this, and I will be abased in your eyes; but by the maids of whom you have spoken, by them I shall be held in honor." Not only is he not phased by what his wife says, he tells her he will worship the Lord even more.

I wanted to cover this because like the Israelites had the Ark with God dwelling among them, we as Catholics have something no one else does. We have God really and truly dwelling among us in the Eucharist - Jesus, the Word of God, the True bread from Heaven, and the Eternal High Priest. The God of creation who no man could come into contact with or he would perish, now allows us to receive Him fully into ourselves. Spend some time contemplating this. Finally, when it comes to worshiping God in the Eucharist, I am not saying we should be dancing up and down the aisles at Mass, but what I am saying is we need to ask ourselves how we are treating this most sacred gift. Are we afraid to sing at Mass, to say the responses, to spend time in Adoration for the fear of what others think? Or do we understand that our God has chosen to dwell among us and there is no greater response than to Worship Him in the Eucharist? Are we more concerned with the opinion of others, or are we centered on active and true participation in the Worship of God?

"Jesus, as you have given me all of yourself, help me to give you all of myself. Amen"


