STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

In today's Gospel, we find the Apostles dejected and discouraged following the death of our Lord. Poor Peter decides to throw in the towel on the whole disciple thing and go back to his old way of life, declaring, "I'm going fishing." Upon hearing this, the other disciples follow him.

How easy it is for all of us to backslide on changes we have made in our lives, especially when it comes to our spiritual lives. But look how Jesus treats the disciples during their "backslide." He is right there with them in the midst of it, already waiting for them on the shore when they come back from their unsuccessful return to the fishing business (after abandoning their mission as disciples). Our Lord greets them tenderly, gives them some fishing pointers, and then prepares their breakfast. How gracious He is to them!

He is just as gracious today. When we find ourselves "out at sea" — discouraged by our failures or for squandering the gifts God has given us, or simply by a lack of progress in our faith life, Jesus is with us! He is calling to us from the shore to come back to Him without shame or embarrassment, but with hope-filled trust in His steadfast love. He never tires of offering "do-overs" if we just keep returning to Him.

This constant process of turning back to the Lord, of reevaluating our goals and priorities as we aim for Heaven, is the essence of a stewardship way of life. Let us take heart as we continue our journey today, secure in the knowledge that Jesus is beside us every step of the way.

NEIGHBORS NEAR & NEIGHBORS FAR:

Church in Central and Eastern Europe

Decades ago, the bishops of the United States established a program to aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe and help it rebuild after decades of communist oppression. The program is funded by an annual collection taken up in dioceses across the United States. That response continues today, as the rebuilding Church faces the new challenges of war and the mass migration of refugees.

From the beginning of the Russian Federation's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 and the subsequent war, the Catholic Church has vigorously responded to the ongoing humanitarian catastrophe by offering shelter, food, medicine, and necessities—as well as spiritual support and comfort—to displaced persons and other war victims.

Together, let us be disciples of Jesus on mission!

Where do Popes come from?

Jesus knew the church he started would need a leader to help keep people all over the world in communion. Before he died, Jesus picked St. Peter for this unique task. For 2,000 years since then, with the help of the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church has followed Christ's example and teaching by picking a person to be the "rock" of Jesus' church on Earth. This person, who is the bishop of Rome, is called the pope!



When it's time for a new pope, the guys in red come into play! These special bishops are named **cardinals**. Cardinals are chosen by popes to help lead the church.

All the Cardinals head to Vatican City, where the Sistine Chapel is. We call this a **conclave**. The cardinals will promise to keep things a secret, then they get locked in the chapel and voting begins!



Cardinals who are younger than 80yrs old get to place votes. They will talk and discuss and place up to four votes a day. They write their votes on ballots that are mixed up and kept secret.



"ELIGO IN SUMMUM PONTIFICEM" IS LATIN FOR "I ELECT AS THE MOST HIGH PONTIFF", AND IT IS WRITTEN ON THE TOP OF ALL THE BALLOTS!

After the ballots are counted, read, and tallied, the cardinals burn them.

If we see black smoke, it means there wasn't an agreement. The cardinals will have to vote again!

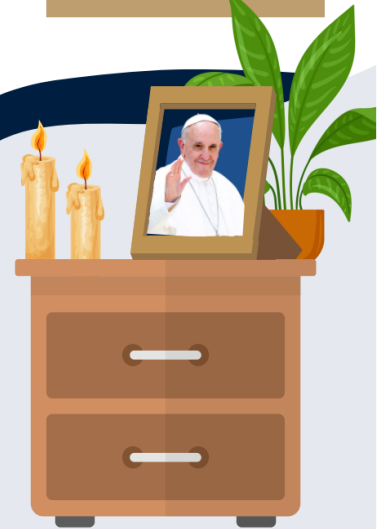
BLACK SMOKE:

The cardinals will continue voting until someone has 2/3rds of the vote. Pope Francis was elected in a day, Pope Gregory X (1271) took three years!



If we see white smoke, it means the cardinals have elected our next Pope!

The person who is elected has to say yes, pick a papal name, and get dressed in pope's clothing. Then, "**habemus papam**" (Latin for "we have a pope") is proclaimed, and the new pope processes onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica!
