REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN

Wisdom 12:13, 16-19 Romans 8:26-27 Matthew 13:24-43

Who of us hasn't played God? Each of us some time in our lives has taken on the role of God. Acting as if we know God and his ways, we have condemned someone possibly to some sort of punishment, have withheld mercy from an individual, and have acted with stinginess and short-sightedness. Do we really know who God is, and how God acts in our world? The parable of the wheat and the weeds (tares) in the Gospel should give us pause to re-examine our attitudes towards others, especially those we judge as not fit for God's kingdom. For if God would use the same standards that we use towards others, we would find ourselves in a terrible predicament. Luckily, our God is beyond our imaginations and beyond our self-righteous attitudes. Our God, as stated in the first reading, is a God who calls us back to himself through repentance. Although our God is just and righteous, he is always merciful and forgiving. May we learn to let God be God. and we be his creatures.

In the first reading from Wisdom, we have this insight into who God truly is. The Book of Wisdom, often called the Wisdom of Solomon, was written some eight centuries after Solomon lived. It was probably written by a well-educated, Greek-speaking Jew, possibly from Alexandria, Egypt. This section we have today was a section specifically dedicated towards God's mercy to sinners. As a just God, the person of God hates sin and the effects of sin. God is especially intolerant against the proud and audacious. Yet, even though God is just, God is also merciful and kind. His one desire for all mankind is to be united with Him forever. Repentance is what God invites us to so that we can become fully united to Him.

In the Gospel we have three parables that teach us about the reign of God. This reign of God was Jesus' sole mission in life. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection was about proclaiming that the reign of God had come. To understand the first parable about the wheat and the weeds we have to understand a common agrarian growth in Palestine. Weeds, darnel or tares in other biblical translations, were a plant that when just sprouting looked very similar to wheat. At harvest time the wheat would have overtaken the darnel or tares in size and would be easily distinguishable. So originally Jesus' message was that all were included in the kingdom even tax collectors, prostitutes, and sinners. All were invited by Jesus to share in the blessings of God's reign. And only at harvest time would we know who was truly wheat and who was truly weeds. Jesus was saying allow God to be God and quit playing God and make judgments on who is acceptable in the reign of God.

The second and third parables both had the same message. From small insignificant beginnings, God could accomplish astounding results. From a small seed like the mustard seed, a great bush could grow that would become a great nesting place for many birds. And from a very little amount of yeast added to fifty pounds of flour would come bread for a hundred people or more.

The Gospel parable especially with the wheat and weeds has great implications for a personal life. Sometimes the areas in our life that we see as evil or weeds may through God's grace become wheat. And what we thought was wheat and

was holy might turn out to be weeds. We have to allow the mercy and wisdom of God's grace to take all the areas of our lives and use them according to his plan. How much more holy our world would be if we stopped playing God. Let God be God, and we be what God made us to be...his obedient creatures.

Update from recent Pastoral Council Meeting.

Competed Projects: Garage header replaced, new door installed. Scaffolding purchased and lights in main body of church replaced.

To Do Projects: Addressing bat issue in church. Still need to finish installing screen in the soffit area on the Munjor School. Will wrap the exposed area around garage door. Repair work to be done on the south interior church wall, some areas are flaking. Touch up painting on exterior areas to be addressed.

<u>Playground</u>: While checking the condition of the playground equipment it was discovered there are areas of deterioration that may eventually cause injury. Also, for insurance purposes there needs to be a required amount of cushion material under the playground equipment. Due to the following issues:

Condition of the equipment

Cost to fix them

Getting that area up to code for insurance and Prevention of accidents/injuries

The council has decided to remove the playground equipment the sand below it and let it fill in with grass. Plans are to remove playground equipment later this year.
