FROM THE DESK OF CODY MARINTZER

Do we pray like children?

To use a skill, we first have to learn it. And with any skill we don't use often enough, we can completely forget it, or become rusty at it. Why would our prayer life be any different? We all need to be taught prayers like the "Our Father." Jesus taught his disciples how to pray this and they handed it on to us. We also need to be taught how to have open conversations with God. Just as children need to be taught how to speak and communicate with others, if we are very young in our faith, or just have never learned, we may need help on how to talk with our Father in Heaven.

On the other hand, we also need to learn how to be a little bit more like children in our prayer life. Matthew 18 says: "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." What is meant by childlike prayer then? Children have the gift to simply trust and are not worried about wasting God's time (as if that's even possible). They know how to invite Him into their day to journey with them.

Children have a great sense of Awe and Wonder, which means they will say whatever is on their mind and talk with whoever will listen. They don't worry about how others may see them. They also don't have a sense of pride that keeps them from asking for what they need, or asking questions for fear of looking dumb. They simply ask.

How Awesome is it that we have a God that isn't bored with or put out by our talking to Him! He isn't perturbed with us for asking for what we need. He is a good Father and wants nothing more than for us to share every moment with Him and to be more childlike by not worrying about external pressures, but instead being filled with Awe, Wonder, and excitement of being in relationship with Him.

I was reminded of this during Advent when I was sitting in Adoration here at St. Nicholas holding my youngest daughter. As a tear of Joy welled up in my eyes from the beauty and Awe of that moment, I turned my head and whispered to her that someday Jesus would hold her like I was and a huge smile came across her face. I am pretty sure Jesus was telling me the same thing. Someday I will meet Him face to face and He will embrace me with the biggest hug.

Childlike faith. Isn't it Beautiful!





EVENTS IN THE HEARTLAND

The "Little Town of Bethlehem" nativity at St. Boniface Catholic Church, Vincent will be open for visitors Sunday Dec. 17th, as well as Saturday Dec. 23, Sunday Dec. 24 and Christmas Day. All times are 1-5pm. Appointments can also be made at any other time by calling Carol at 785-735-9282. This is the 97th year of the nativity, begun by the parish priest Fr. Callistus Rectenwald in 1927. Rocks from all 50 states and 105 countries surround the scene, in particular rocks from the Cave of Lourdes and the Sea of Galilee. Infant Jesus is from Spain, and Mary, Joseph and the Three Kings are from Germany. A special section of the nativity is dedicated to our veterans who could not be home for Christmas over the years, featuring rocks from Germany, Vietnam, Korea, Japan, Wake Island and Christmas Island to name a few. Four trickling waterfalls, animals and shepherds dot the scene surrounding the Bethlehem Inn, and the stable made from a nearby pear tree in 1927. St. Boniface Catholic Church is located 5.5 miles south of Victoria and two miles east.
