## REFLECTION FROM DEACON STEVE URBAN:

Wisdom: 6: 12-16 Thessalonians 4: 13-18 Matthew 25: 1-13

In Kenny Chesney's 2008 country song "Everybody Wants to Go to Heaven", the listener hears the preacher say to "start living right". After hearing the need to quit the women and whiskey, the person in the song says he desires heaven, but doesn't want to go today because he's not ready. The song says it all! We all want heaven, but we don't want to go today because we're just not ready. All three Scripture readings today confront us with our need to be prepared...to be ready when God calls.

In the first reading from the book of Wisdom, Lady Wisdom is this lovely person who is intimately related to God. All who seek God want to be in the presence of Wisdom. For she is the great treasure for all who desire union with God. And she makes herself available at the city gate, the place where commerce and knowledge would be found. But those who seek her must keep vigil. They must be waiting and watchful. In the letter to the Thessalonians, Paul encourages us to live hopefully in anticipation of Jesus' final coming when both those who have died and those still living will be taken up into heaven. Then in Matthew's Gospel Jesus relates the parable of the ten virgins waiting for the bride to come. Five of them were ready for the bridegroom with plenty of oil in their lamps, and five were unprepared with no extra oil to light the way for the groom. In Jesus day the bride and her wedding party waited while the men bargained to gain the largest dowry. Because this bargaining would drag on into the night, it was common that weddings would take place in the evening or midnight. The only difference between the wise and foolish virgins is that wise ones were prepared for whatever came next.

So how might we get prepared for his coming? I think we must know that there are two comings to prepare for. The first coming is our death...the second is His daily coming into our lives. In every respect, the two go hand in hand. We prepare to meet our maker by living our daily lives aware of his presence. We sometimes miss the daily opportunities to meet our God. God comes to us through other people first and foremost. What are our relationships like with other people? Are we giving and forgiving with others? Or are we self-centered and always worrying about me. Secondly do we find God in our work and the daily routines of our life? Do we see our work as

cooperating with God in building up His kingdom? Finally, do we see God's presence in nature...events in history.... in the world?

What changes will we need to make to get ourselves ready and prepared? I think we have to have some practice to make us aware of the Divine. Awareness starts with solitude and reflection. Everyday we have to rest in the recesses of our heart. We have to make time for quiet and silence so we can discern where God is acting in our lives. Along with solitude, we need a daily examination of consciousness. This daily practice requires us to ask these two questions. Where was God present in my life today? And secondly where did I miss God's presence in my life today? How did I fail to see God acting in my work, my family, and my surroundings? Awareness, solitude, and an examination of consciousness will lead us to know God's presence and be prepared for each of his comings into our lives.



8:30pm, on Thursday, Nov. 12, in the Black and Gold Room of the Memorial Union. The workshop is designed specifically for those involved with FHSU campus ministries, according to a news release. "We want to provide FHSU campus ministries with a practical, Christian faithbased training opportunity so you can feel prepared to have these difficult, yet essential, conversations. Additionally, we will discuss how to promote resilience within your ministry groups, as growing resilience is one of the best protective factors to prevent suicidal thoughts from taking root in the first place," the news release stated.
